FOUNDATION

Hampton Rovers Amateur Football Club first started as an organized activity for the First Hampton Scout Group by Norm (Boss) James in 1918. The Scout Group's main theme was to promote football as a team game and encourage self confidence, self control and a desire to improve a player's ability. This is similar to the current philosophy used by Hampton Rovers today.

Initially, games were played socially against other Scout Groups and then in the Association Sub-district competition. But, as the incentive to play a higher standard became apparent, another competition was sought and in 1933 Hampton Rovers was accepted into the Metropolitan Amateur Football competition which later became the Victorian Amateur Football Association.

In 1963 the Club moved from the Ludstone Street ground to the corner of David Street and Bluff Road, our present home. In 2002 this ground was formally named the "Boss James Reserve" in memory of our founder.

In 1979 the Club started its youth policy by introducing junior teams in an effort to provide an extensive link with the local community and to provide a development scheme for our senior side. Since 1979, 32 premierships, including two this season, Under 10 and Under 15, have been won.

Three senior and eighteen junior sides together with Auskick represented the Rovers in 2005, equating to over 500 registered players, making the Rovers one of the biggest Australian Rules clubs in Australia and the world!

Thus, from humble beginnings, the Players, Committees and loyal Supporters have nurtured Hampton Rovers over many years and assisted in creating the strong Family Club we are today.

PETER BLICK

Peter started at Hampton Rovers in 1987 when his son Simon started playing in the juniors. From that time Peter has held numerous official positions both at junior and senior levels. There was barely a season that he was not giving of his time for the club.

In 1988 and 1989 Peter was junior president and was boundary umpire for Simon's team from 1987 to 1991.

Peter's commitment to the seniors has been outstanding.

In the early days he was our players advocate at the VAFA Tribunal, reserve grade umpire from 1993 to 1997, senior team manager from 2001 and still holds this position in 2005, committee member and club president in 1990 and 1991. In 2005 Peter has once again taken on the arduous task of club president.

STEPHEN GUY

Steve arrived at the Rovers in 1982 when he played 16 games in the under 19s. However from 1983 to 1993 Steve put away the footy jumper and took on the task of boundary umpire, firstly for the reserves, then U19s and from 1987 to 1992 for the seniors. Throughout those years, he also coached an under 10 side in 1985 and 1986 and was runner for the under 15s in 1989 and 1990. In 1991 Steve found himself pulling on the jumper for another three games to help out when the numbers were low. In 1992 and 1993 he was back boundary umpiring, played two games in 1994 and was now team manager of the reserves. In 1995 and 1996 Steve was still the reserves team manager. In 1997 he played another game for the Rovers but was also goal umpire for the reserves. From 1998 to 2000 he was reserves team manager and from 2001 to 2005 has been the under 19 team manager and at the same time has been team manager for junior teams.

Although Stephen only played 22 games for the Rovers, he has participated in well over 400 games in one way or another during 24 continuous years of service to our club.

Both Peter and Stephen are valued members of the Rovers Community and we congratulate them on their life membership.

Ian started at the Rovers in 1965 as a player, accumulating 284 games over two decades. He was coach of the Reserves Grade for eight years and in those eight years his charges played in 14 finals matches, winning one flag in 1979 and runners up twice.

Ian has had several stints on the senior committee, firstly between 1966 and 1972, then in 1996, 1999 and 2004. He has been vice-president, club secretary, registration secretary and VAFA delegate.

The VAFA appointed him one of their state selectors for five years and he spent two years on the VAFA permits committee.

Ian was awarded the Hampton Rovers Best Clubman Award in 1969 and is an inaugural member of our Hall of Fame.

In 2005 the senior committee nominated Ian for a VAFA certificate of merit award and this award was presented to him at the Presidents, Secretaries and Members dinner held at the Carlton Crest Hotel.

Senior President's Report

I am pleased to present members with my report for the 2005 football season. My two main objectives when taking on the role of Senior President this year was to ensure the Club was financially stable and to strive for on-field success. The first objective was achieved but unfortunately a horror run with serious injuries robbed us of the chance of achieving the second.

Football Operations

I would like to express my appreciation to all in the football department of the Club for their efforts during the season.

Despite continued frustrations with injuries during the season, Senior Coach **Brett McIlwraith** never wavered in his commitment to the players and the Club. Despite having a significant number of our best players out for much of the season, the attitude of the coaching staff and the players remained positive throughout and the team was very competitive to the very last game. In recognizing Brett's efforts, the Committee was unanimous in reappointing him for the 2006 season and I am sure that with just a little bit of luck he will bring us success.

Brett was ably assisted this season by Assistant Coach **Chris Gawne** and Chairman of Selectors **Richard Gillan**. As always, **David Rogerson** started work at the commencement of pre-season training and his input both with training and as the Senior Runner was again invaluable. I really appreciate the assistance each of you has given this year.

After a dream season in 2004, **Anthony Naumoff's** job as Reserves Coach was a nightmare this season. For the first game of the season, eighteen players were unable to get a game. At the end of season, with approximately 22 injured players, the Club struggled to field a Reserves side. I have no doubt that if it had not been for the efforts of "Freddie" in somehow finding enough players to make up a team, the Reserves would probably have forfeited at least two games this season. This would have been the first time this has occurred in the Club's history. This problem is not unfamiliar to Freddie and yet he continues to give his services to the Club year after year without complaint. Thanks Freddie.

Max Grimmer was again Team Manager for the reserves but his input into the football side of the club (as well as other areas) is far wider. Thanks again Max. Your efforts are greatly appreciated.

Dale Ross took on the difficult role of Under 19's Coach this season and did an excellent job. The Under 19's were successful in reaching the finals this year and whilst being eliminated in the first final, their efforts throughout the year were terrific. When you consider that a number of Under 19 players played most of the season in the Seniors making them ineligible for the finals, their season could have been even more successful than it was. I extend my thanks to Dale and to



Steve Guy, Paul Curry, Andy O'Brien and everyone else who assisted with the Under 19's this season and I hope that every Under 19 player stays with the Club next season.

Once again **Kevin Marks** organized trainers and masseurs for all teams this season and did an excellent job. I spoke to Kevin at the start of the season about the need to keep training and medical costs tight and Kevin was able to achieve this during the year whilst at the same time maintaining a professional level of service to all teams. Many thanks to you and all your staff Kevin.

My thanks also go to all the other people who assisted on match days – **Jason Cave** (Interchange) **Graham Carr** (Goal Umpire and Scoreboard) **Athol Porter** and **Geoff Morely** (Timekeepers) **Cam Voss** (Video) **Denis Flynn** and **Brad Trembath** (Boundary and Water) **Scott McGregor, Cam McGregor, Alan Lake** and **Sarah** (Reserves Umpires and Boundary) **Stephen Hope** (Scoreboard) and the various other people who assisted with statistics, water etc throughout the year. I sincerely apologise to any person who I may have overlooked.

Players

This Club is fortunate to have not only a great group of players but also a great group of young men. Modern life presents many challenges to young people but it also offers them many interesting and attractive options. The commitment shown by our players, in playing football for the Club without financial reward, means that they have to forego some of those other options. It is important that we all recognize this when assessing the significance of their commitment.

I sincerely thank each and every player who gave his time to play for the Club this year and hope to see you all next season. Lack of success is just as frustrating for the players as it is for the coaching staff and supporters. The extent of the injuries to key players this year is something which could not be predicted and the nature of the injuries (impact related) makes them difficult to control. The loss of three or four good players has had significant effect on the performance of a number of AFL clubs this year where the depth of good players would be expected to be far better than ours. When you consider that we have had serious injuries to eight or more of our very best players this year (many season ending) then I feel that the performance of the players this year has been excellent.

I am very confident that if we all stick together and show the same commitment next season, they will taste the success they deserve.

I would also like to thank **Don Scarlett** for his assistance on lunch days this year and for his organization of the very successful 10th Anniversary Dinner and the Domino's Lunch which is an important fund raiser for the Club. Many thanks Don.

Hampton Rovers entered season 2005 with a great deal of optimism, based on the return of four overseas 'recruits', the return of Heath Tregear to HRAFC, and the prospect of further improvement from our young group of players.

We started the year extremely well, apart from the horrendous injury to James Hanlon in the first game, and although we dropped consecutive games to Parkdale, and Beaumaris, we were in a position to take second spot on the ladder if we were to beat Monash in Rd 7, but unfortunately just fell short.

From this point on, our club was devastated by injuries, and most, if not all, of these injuries were of a serious nature, and not soft tissue injuries.

The season for the Rovers then became an even bigger struggle, but to our credit we competed hard, and put ourselves in a position to win nearly every game we played. Our greatest losing margin was 42pts, with most games being decided by 3 goals or less. In many ways this is a positive for our club, as the playing group are making a concerted effort to narrow the gap between our best and worst performances.

Once again Rovers should enter the 2006 season with a great deal of optimism. Although a year older, the 4 o'seas 'recruits' should contribute even more, after a season behind them, and a full pre-season. We played four U19's in the seniors, and as long as they make it happen, become fully involved in the senior club, complete a full pre-season, and embrace the requirements of becoming a successful senior player, their contribution could be invaluable.
