FOUNDATION

Hampton Rovers Amateur Football Club first started as an organised activity for the First Hampton Scout Group by Norm (Boss) James in 1918. The Scout Group's main theme was to promote football as a team game and encourage self confidence, self control and a desire to improve a player's ability. This is similar to the current philosophy used by Hampton Rovers today.

Initially, games were played socially against other Scout Groups and then in the Association Sub-district competition. But, as the incentive to play a higher standard became apparent, another competition was sought and in 1933 Hampton Rovers was accepted into the Metropolitan Amateur Football competition which later became the Victorian Amateur Football Association.

In 1963 the Club moved from the Ludstone Street ground to the corner of David Street and Bluff Road, our present home. In 2002 this ground was formally named the "Boss James Reserve" in memory of our founder.

In 1979 the Club started its youth policy by introducing junior teams in an effort to provide an extensive link with the local community and to provide a development scheme for our senior side. Since 1979, 35 junior premierships have been won, including three this season: U16, U13East & U12West.

The Rovers have won seven senior premierships, and were the first club to win premierships in each of the four sections, including the 'A' Section flag in 1951. Nine reserve and seven under 19 premierships have also been won by the club.

Three senior and sixteen junior sides represented the Rovers in 2007, equating to 470 registered players, plus 125 kids participating in Auskick, making the Rovers one of the largest Australian Rules Football clubs.

SENIOR PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I am pleased to present members with my report for the 2007 football season. Our club is an important community asset and the support for both of our charity events this year clearly displayed the potential role that we can play in the community. As president, the success of both "A Good Day's Night" and "Cocktails for a Cause" is one of the achievements of which I am most proud. We also embarked on some minor refurbishments at the club and I am proud to say that the Don Scarlett Bar is a major improvement to the interior of the club.

Football Operations

A special mention must go to Kyle Pinto, who won the U19 competition Best and Fairest award. With players of the calibre of Kyle coming through the club, we can feel confident of future successes.

I would implore all current players to embrace the challenge of C-grade in 2008 with the same vibrance and enthusiasm that was displayed at the beginning of the 2007 season, so that we may realise our potential and achieve our long term aim of establishing the club as a consistent upper grade amateur force.

The appointment of Marc Stafford as the pre-season fitness trainer for this season was a key factor in our success this year and I am proud to announce that Marc will be committing himself to the task again for the 2007/2008 pre-season.

A number of initiatives were mooted throughout the year that were designed to bolster the club's ability to attract new players. One highly successful move was to run a stall at the St Leonard's College fete. I believe that this move will strengthen



ties with the school and facilitate the transition of players from the school and in to our ranks. We have many close ties with St Leonard's and the club's future is dependent on such local community connections.

I would like to thank all players and supporters who aided the football component of the club this year. The support and feeling generated throughout the year was tremendous and augers well for a bright football future.

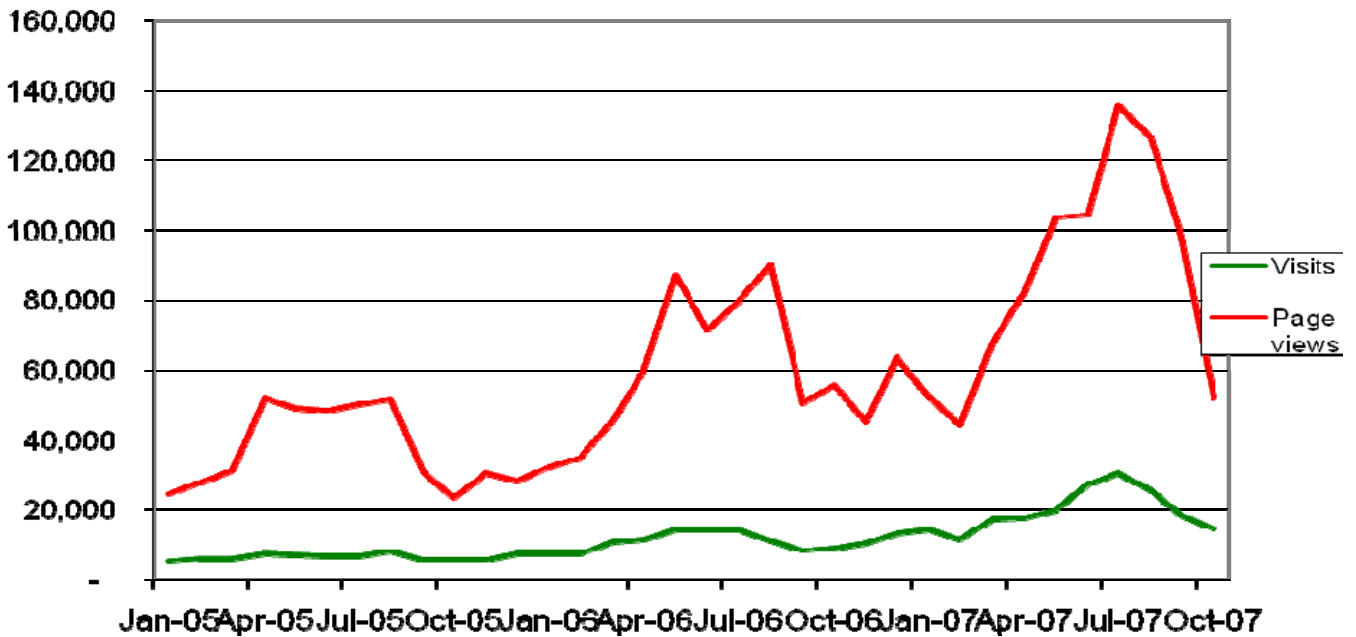
WEBSITE REPORT

2007 has been yet another fantastic year for the Hampton Rovers website. After website traffic almost doubled last year, the trend continued this year with a 85% increase in visits to the site. Up to the end of October, the site was visited a total of 198,730 (compared to 108,117 in '06 and 63,702 in '05) and a total of 869,342 pages were viewed (compared to 610,205 in '06 and 391,557 in '05). There are now 816 online members who enjoy full access to the site include game and goal stats for all the 500+ players and receive the weekly club newsletter. I'm proud of the fact that we continue to have one of the leading club websites going around. It's certainly a goal of mine to ensure this continues to be the case into the future. With this in mind, several updates will again be made in preparation for the 2008 season. This year the basic layout of the site was maintained with a number of new features including improved site search powered by Google and a RSS news feed, we were also treated to quality match-day photos of senior games thanks to Berk McGowan. I would like to thank everyone for their input including Marie Turner (junior fixtures/results) and Paul Pavlou (junior game/goal stats).

We had 2 good years, which was full of great football, laughs and camaraderie. If the club can keep these kids, I'm sure we will have long term success.

I had many helpers throughout the year, but Scott McGregor was my runner and coach in my absence. I know he enjoyed the past 2 years and has built up some good friendships with these young adults. George Schmitz accepted the role as Team Manager and did a tremendous job, ensuring we had the necessary tasks completed. Dean Vine was there each week, helping with water, stats or any other task that needed completing. We had Kathryn (Froggy) for the 2nd year in a row as trainer, her skills are exceptional and very much appreciated. Jason Cave completed the interchange stewards role again and truly deserved his life membership award on Presentation night. I thank all these helpers for their commitment and passion and without people like them, we wouldn't be able to field a side each week.

A personal thank you to Brodie and Joe. Brodie has supported me throughout my sporting endeavours and watched most games and shared my highs and lows. Without her support I couldn't have put the time and effort in to ensure 2007 was a success. Thank you Brodie.

In closing I would like to thank, my leaders, the players and their parents for their support, hard work and efforts throughout season 2007. I wish you all a long and prosperous football career with Hampton Rovers and hope you taste the ultimate success in the not so distant future - a Premiership.
